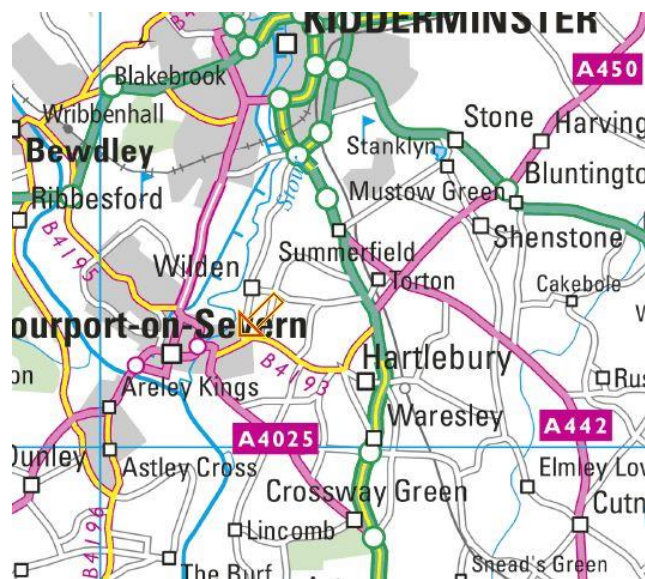


West Midlands Relays 2017
Hartlebury Common, Stourport
29th October 2017

Initial Details (Aug 2017)

Venue: Hartlebury Common is located above the eastern bank of the River Severn, overlooking Stourport a few miles south of Kidderminster. The car park will be at the Stourport Manor Hotel on the north side of the B4193 between Stourport and the village of Hartlebury (DY13 9JA, GR SO825715). The venue is easily accessible from the A449 between Worcester and Kidderminster. The route to the event will not be signed.



Car Park: Hardstanding cordoned off western area of the Hotel car park. Overflow car parking behind the hotel at the sports club car park. Please do not use the public car park which serves the Country Park.

Terrain: As varied as they come: A sandy bluff which used to be the bank of the river Severn, flat former flood plain below, gently sloping plateau above. Mostly rough open heath with patches of windblown sand, broom and gorse. Large & small patches of naturally seeded birch and oak and 2 small conifer plantations. Used to be a rabbit warren, then used for salt processing (hence some rather unusual plants), sand and gravel extraction, rifle ranges, practice trenches for WW1, clay pits and industrial tipping - leaving lots and lots a small brown line features!

Assembly: on the common, 5 minutes flat walk from the car park. This crosses the busy B4193 into the access road for the Hartlebury Common Nature Reserve - PLEASE TAKE CARE (see Safety). follow tapes. **No club tents are allowed at assembly.** However a tent will be provided for waiting runners to shelter from inclement weather. **Map issue and download will be located at assembly.**

Enquiries & Registration: Located on the common in assembly, Enquiries will have an envelope for club captains to collect containing any additional information and hired SI cards which will need to be paid for before they are handed over. Last minute changes will be made at Enquiries and taken to Download prior to the start.

Facilities: Toilets in the car park, there will be no toilets at assembly . please do not use the hotel toilets. Refreshments (lunches and drinks) are available at the hotel but please do not go in with dirty clothes or shoes. Other traders/cake stall TBA

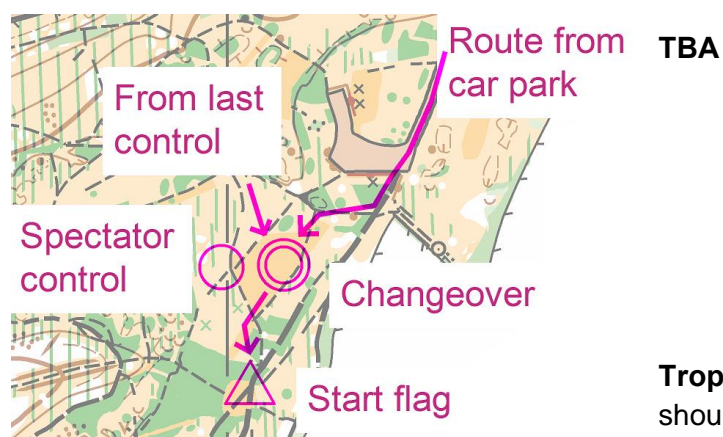
Map: 1:10 000 with 5m contours. A4 on waterproof paper. Based on the previous 2014 map with updates in 2017.

Start times: Mini relay 11:05, all other classes 11:00 . call-up for first leg runners from 10:45am (for the mini-relay, call up will be immediately after the mass start for all other classes). Mini-mass start probably at 1pm.
