For the map I used the Open O-Map application extension of OpenStreetMap, which offers just about enough functionality for this sort of event. Some of the basemap detail wasn't quite correct, but it's not difficult to sign up as a volunteer contributor to OSM and make the necessary corrections.

I realised that I hadn't quite got the planning right just after the start when everyone headed down the hill; evidently the 20 and 30 point controls in the south-west corner were a little bit too attractive and offered an anti-clockwise loop with the climb about halfway round and then a downhill finish. Robert Rose won out despite being over three minutes late, bagging all the 30 pointers and leaving out the lower value controls in the middle.

I was a little surprised to find that all the stickers were still in place; on a couple of occasions, including my east-west confusion at the bridge, the back-up questions had to be resorted to. I was tempted to not put the sticker out at #23; the vicar of St Paul's Blackheath is Rev Sermon.

Plans are afoot for another NSL in the Stourport/Kidderminster area on 08 Mar. Watch this space!
