gates.

the Maprun app.

Courses: One hour score course using MapRun. 21 controls of 20 points each. Penalty of

10 points a minute for late finish. See the instructions on the HOC website on how to use the MapRun app. If you don't have the app the course can be recorded on

a GPS watch and can be sent to the MapRun admin to upload.
