Venue & Travel

Kinver Edge is S of Kinver. Car parking will be in the NT car park on the NE side of the area. Grid Reference SO 832 835 DY7 5NP. Take Stone lane off Kinver High Street. This becomes Compton Road which passes the car park for the Rock Houses. Take the next left into Kingsford Lane and the car park is a little along on the right. It is a free car park.

Terrain:

A scarp slope runs NE to SW through the area. Below the scarp is mostly birch woodland with clearings and heath and contour detail. There is both bramble and bracken but these can be avoided. On the eastern dip slope of the scarp there is a mixture of heathland and plantation. Watch out for the new scrapes made for bees.

MapRunF details:

Prior to travelling the map can be found on the MapRunF app by navigating to:

Select event - UK - West Midlands -

No PIN required.

If you are at the location it can be found by using the "Events near me" button on the Maprun app.

Map:

Scale 1:10,000. Updated in September 2020 by Alison Sloman with new Lidar data . ISOM 2017-2 specification.

Courses:

One hour score course using MapRunF. 27 controls of 20 points each. Penalty of 10 points a minute for late finish. See the instructions on the HOC website on how to use the MapRun app. If you don't have the app the course can be recorded on a GPS watch and can be sent to the MapRun admin to upload.

Start/Finish:

The start is in the car park on the NE side of the area off Kingsford Lane. Grid reference SO 832 835. The finish is in the adjacent picnic area to the NE of the car park.

No toilets at venue.
