Thanks to all for coming to the event and well done for finding it as I had given up trying to give any meaningful directions, such is the state of upheaval on Birmingham's road network at the moment.

In the few days leading up to the event there were closures to two pedestrian footpaths which were on obvious route choices leading to manual map amendments and the wholesale removal of all the lampposts (and thus one control) in a particular road.

Birmingham has massive potential for a proper urban and everyone agreed that it was great to run through as part of the Night Street League. However, it does have a major dual-carriageway cutting through the area. Consequently, in the interests of safety, I displayed the map and courses prior to the start so that everyone could appraise themselves of the safe crossing points for their courses.

Also, although I had made it clear in advance what the penalty would be for late return on the medium and long courses, I hadn't made it clear what the penalty would be for missing a compulsory control. In the end I settled on 20 points as a mere 10 point penalty could have made a tactical swap of controls, look attractive.
