- Parking:** Public car park at Church Street, Stourbridge, DY8 1LY. Currently free parking for 2 hours and after 7pm but tickets must be obtained from machine.
- Travel:** Nearest rail and bus stations at Stourbridge Town, just 400m north of car park/ event centre. Regular services from Birmingham & Worcester.
- Terrain:** Urban orienteering and map running with options to run along streets, footpaths, and through urban parks.
- Map:** A4 sized 1:10,000 scale map on Open O map. Printed on non-waterproof paper so please bring a transparent map bag.
- No separate control descriptions: Controls numbered 1-12 are all postboxes. All other controls can be pinpointed by map reading.
- Course & Scoring:** Using MapRun6 App which is free to download onto a smart 'phone. 60 minute score, with controls taken in any order worth 20 points each. Any time over 60 minutes will be penalised at the rate of 10 points per minute, or part thereof. PIN number to unlock the course will be provided on the night. Competitors may adjust scores using HITMO function.
- Entries:** Please notify planner in advance to reserve a map. Entries £5/ adult & £2/junior, preferably payable by card on the night
- Start Times:** Mass start at 7pm subject to social distance rules. Persons wanting to run earlier, or who may arrive later should notify Planner or NSL Coordinator.
- Facilities:** Nearest toilets in the bus station (20p coin) or outside Tesco in the town centre (free). Pub of the night is The Chequers Inn 96 High Street, Stourbridge, DY8 1EQ, 300m northwest of car park. Food served until 11pm.

- Safety:** Competitors take part at their own risk. Hi-vis clothing recommended at all times and headtorches should be used.
- The majority of roads in the event area are quiet, but Stourbridge has the usual busy main roads. **Specifically, the very obvious central area ring road is extremely busy and must only be crossed using underpasses or light controlled crossings marked on the map.** A larger-scale map showing the ring road crossing points in more detail will be provided.
- Participants are expected to observe social distancing and other coronavirus guidelines issued by the government.
