Organiser Comments:

For this event, I wanted runners to contend with the labyrinth of paths and cul de sacs that can be found in north Rubery/Frankley, which are some of the most dense and confusing that I could identify. The difficulty with that however was finding a suitable event HQ; Longbridge Methodist being the best I could find, albeit at the edge of the map with limited options in and out. Feedback for the HQ was positive, which was good for future reference.

Despite the awkward start/finish, I was generally happy with the area when receiving; the north of the map was a difficult as expected and the area adjacent to the HQ, around the cinema, was different and offered some interesting challenges such as the bridge/path crossing that was not mutually accessible!

The conditions on the night were a bit wild but did calm during the event window, allowing for reasonable running albeit with wet feet! They were certainly better than the original date, which would have been lethal due to the frozen snow still on the ground.

14 runners braved the conditions with Eloise topping the table with 27/30 controls visited. I think had Eloise not gone for 27 and 2 at the start, instead aiming straight for 21, she might have had time to finish with the 29/25/18/2/27 loop to finish - that was the only way I could see to complete the course at least. Spotting that on the night wasn't easy though.

John clinched second, just beating Peter on time, though with 4 minutes to spare I'm sure there was time to have grabbed another control! Perhaps he didn't want to risk losing the title of most efficient runner - averaging 2.7 controls per km.

In addition to Eloise and John, shout outs go to: Simon, Lewis, Claire and William, who were the only runners brave enough to attempt the summit control perched on Rubery Hill, hope the wet descent wasn't too slippery!

And lastly, the award for best time keeping went to Andy Howman who managed to stop the clock dead on the hour.

Thanks to all those who were able to make it and apologies to those who had originally planned to run but then couldn't make the revised date.
