It was nice to welcome some newer faces, and I was pleased that a number took advantage of the convenient train service to get to Stourbridge. I was pleased with the welcome extended by The Crabmill in hosting our event (especially as it meant I could stay in the warm on a cold, but dry, evening). I had planned the course to be challenging, and to provide plenty of route selection options, and I believe I succeeded as everyone had to make decisions about what to leave out. I had located several controls at the ends of cul-de-sacs to extend the course length, but apologise if I overdid this as there were comments about having to run up and down a lot of dead ends.

Congratulations to Ben Crone with an impressive 20 out of 30 possible controls, brilliantly timed with just 11 seconds to spare, and to Eloise Lee with 19, heading the W table, albeit nearly a couple of minutes over time. This was her last event before she moves north (with Simon to follow soon after). We are going to miss them both, as they have made such a mark on the NSL scene.
