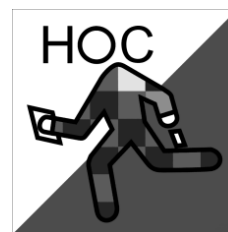

Travel**

Reclaimed former colliery site and adjoining woodland with dense path network.
Car park grid ref SO897931, entrance off the A463 between Sedgley and Wombourne at Gospel End village. Postcode DY3 4HB.

Parking:

Parking in surfaced car park, pay and display charge £3.00.

Terrain:

Mixture of open hills (old spoil tips) and woodlands of varying maturity.

Map:

1:7500 on A4 by Alison Sloman updated 2022. Pre-marked on non-waterproof paper – polypockets will be available if you need to want to protect your map from water.

Courses:

One linear score course, around 5.5km total length. 60 minute time limit – visit as many controls as you can (or want to). Controls can be omitted but must be visited in order, e.g. 2-3-4-6-8-9-10 would be valid. A subset of controls will form a technically easy short course suitable for newcomers.

Entries:

Please let the Organiser know in advance so that he can print and reserve maps. A limited stock will be available for entry on the day.

Punching:

Electronic punching using SportIdent. Please bring your SI-Card if you have one. Club SI-Cards may be borrowed if you don't have your own.

Seniors £5 Juniors £1

Toilets and café on site.
